This score for <u>Ocean: An Improvised Song Cycle</u> is a suggestion of how one might improvise a performance about the ocean. It is also a record of our performance at the inaugural concert of the EcoVoice Festival at the University of Illinois Chicago on the evening of July 8, 2022.

Performers should feel free to do as they please. The number of movements and performers might change, the instrumentation swapped out, or any number of alterations. Performers could even take the opportunity to perform a cycle about the sun, a climate activist, or composting. The options are infinite. Performers have our permission to do as they please. We only ask that the performance be meaningful to them and their audience.

Suggested Performance Method

Movement I

At the time of performance, find a recent news article or scientific writing about "ocean." Read the title and a few paragraphs aloud so everyone can hear and get a sense of what the article is about. Use that as inspiration for the first movement.

Movement II

Select a photograph related to the ocean. After looking at the photo and talking through what you see, use that as inspiration for this second movement.

Note: For our performance on July 8, 2022, we asked our audience ahead of time to select their favorite of four photos we supplied.

Movement III

Select a poem, essay, or other literary work. Read the text or an excerpt aloud so everyone can hear. Use that as inspiration for the first movement.

Note: For our performance on July 8, 2022, we asked our audience ahead of time to select their favorite of three texts we supplied.
